Regulations for Dormitory Network Traffic

I. Dormitory students must register their IP addresses at the beginning of each semester, when they change dormitories at the beginning of the summer and winter vacations, or each time they change dormitory rooms. Registration becomes effective at the top of the next hour after it is completed.

II. At the end of their dormitory stay, students must delete the IP addresses they have registered online. Information on the dormitory network is provided by the NCCU Office of Student Affairs.

III. The application deadline for the dormitory network is based on the official dormitory check-in time announced by the NCCU Office of Student Affairs.

IV. Students who fail to correctly complete the application form and are therefore unable to use the dormitory network and receive notifications from the University are solely responsible for the impairment of their rights and interests.

V. The limit for data traffic outflow is 5 GB (5,120 MB) per person per day (the period is counted from 0:00 to 24:00). Information on daily data traffic can be found at http://zepper.nccu.edu.tw/N/.

VI. If the above limit is exceeded, the management system will automatically reduce the speed of incoming and outgoing data traffic for the day:

The speed of outgoing data traffic will be immediately reduced to 64 Kbps.

The speed of incoming data traffic will be immediately reduced to 512 Kbps.

The speed of data traffic within the campus will remain unchanged.

VII. The use of all peer-to-peer applications within the dormitory network is prohibited unless expressly permitted. Those wishing to use peer-to-peer applications may apply via the permanent IP address of the University with permission from the relevant supervisor. VIII. If you experience traffic issues, please bring your student card and visit the Networking and Development Section on the 5th floor of the Computer Center within six days (traffic information is only stored for six days). IX. Violations of relevant regulations or disruptions to network operations, such as the infringement of intellectual property rights, attacks on other users by computer viruses, the disruption or destruction of other users' devices or nodes in the network, the transmission of illegal information, and the sending of advertising will result in the suspension of network usage rights. The suspension of network usage rights shall be lifted after the management unit has acknowledged that improvements have been made. If no improvements have been made, the suspension will continue. In serious cases, the offending student will be referred to the NCCU Office of Student Affairs for disciplinary action.
